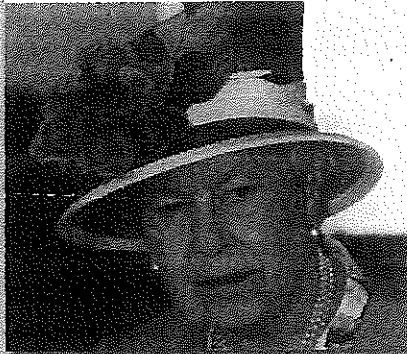
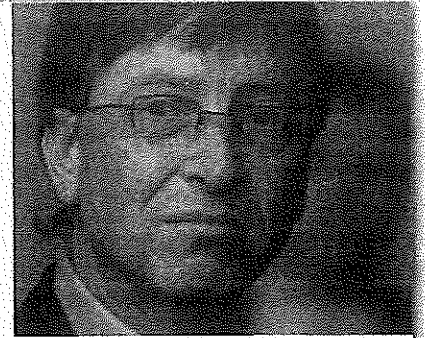
Bill Gates

ENGLISH FOOD has a bad reputation. Everybody knows what French food is, and Indian food, and Chinese food. But what is English food?

It is true that, for many years, food in Britain wasn't good. But it is now possible to eat in England and enjoy it! English cooks know a lot more about how to cook, and they borrow ideas from all over the world.

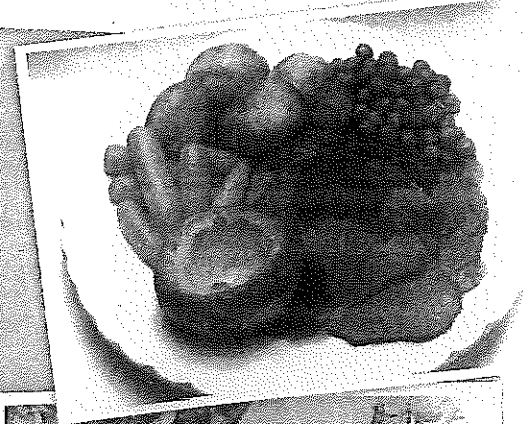
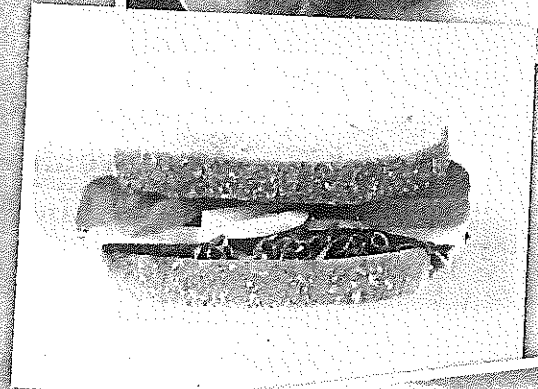
Dinner The evening meal is our main meal. We don't eat late – we eat at about 8. People have maybe meat or pasta, with vegetables or salad.

Eating out Every high street in Britain has an Indian restaurant and a Chinese restaurant. In London there are restaurants from all over the world – Greek, Italian, Moroccan, Mexican, Lebanese, Iranian ... everywhere. Our traditional fast food is fish and chips, and of course there are places to buy burgers and pizza.

It is possible to eat really bad food in England. But it is also possible to eat very well!
