### 1. Sound, Echo

- Sound: Something heard or can be heard. e.g: She opened the window without a sound.
- Echo: a sound reflected from a surface so that it seems to be repeated.

#### e.g:

- 1. Her scream was followed by a loud echo.
- 2. The walls threw the echoes of his footsteps.
- 3. He listened but he heard only the echo of his call.

## 2. <u>Discovery</u>, Invention

- discovery: finding something nobody knew or had found before.
  - e.g: The discovery of X-rays changed the history of medicine.
- invention: a progress of making or design something for the first time.
  - e.g: Books had to be written by hand before the invention of printing.

### 3. steer, drive

- steer: to control
  - e.g : Can you push the car while I steer ?She steered me towards the door. This car is very easy to steer.
- drive : to ride
  - e.g: Can you drive your car slowly.

# 4. follow, watch

• follow: to watch and listen to somebody / something very carefully.

e.g: If you want to understand, you will have to follow what he says carefully.

• watch: to look carefully at somebody / something.

e.g : Will you like to play too ? No, thanks . I'll just watch.

# 5. earn, win

• earn: to get money by working.
e.g: He earns his living as an

actor. How much does a

doctor earn?

• win: to be the best, first or strongest in a race, game,....

e.g: Which party do you think will win the next election?

### 6. regard, look at

• regard: to think of somebody/ something (in aparticular way).

e.g: I regard him as my best friend.

• look at: to examine something and try to find out what is wrong with it.

e.g: Can you look at my car?

### 7. worship, warship

- worship: to pray to and show respect for God. e.g: In primitive societies people worshipped the sun.
- warship: a ship with guns that is used in a war. e.g: A warship moves to achieve the aim.

### 8. bake, boil and roast

- bake: to cook in an oven in dry heat. e.g: She baked him a cake.
- boil: to cook in boiling water. e.g: He doesn't even know how to boil an egg.
- roast: to cook or be cooked over a fire. e.g: This is a smell of roasting meat.
